Dear Haddam and Higganum Friends,

You probably have seen variations of the joke: "The most useless purchase I've ever made was a 2020 Planner." I chuckled recently when I stumbled upon my own version of this: a document on my computer confidently titled "2020 General Planning Calendar FCCH & HCC."

I assure you I haven't drafted such a document for 2021.

And yet, we do know "generally" what the coming year will bring for these two churches worshipping and serving as one:

God will continue to sustain you, and you will continue in faithful service.

We know because "*Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever*" (Hebrews 13:8), and because this past year has shown us the members and friends of FCCH and HCC have not "*grow[n] weary in doing good*" (Galatians 6:9).

This isn't to say the world doesn't change and with it our understanding of how we are called to serve the world in Christ's name. *In 2021 FCCH and HCC will continue to adapt and adjust.*

JOINT MISSION/OUTREACH JANUARY 2021

The Joint Mission/Outreach committee met in December to plan our end of the year donations. We reviewed the many requests received by the churches and decided that we would support six organizations as follows:

- Middlesex Hospital chaplaincy- a local agency that supports people of all ages who are hospitalized.
- Holy Joe's Coffee Ministry- an agency based in Wallingford that supports coffee house programs developed by chaplains in military bases around the world.
- Nathaniel B. Field Memorial Foundation- a local agency that supports suicide prevention counseling and activities in our town.
- UCC Back Bay Mission- a community ministry in Biloxi, Mississippi, that meets emergency needs and helps people begin their journeys out of poverty.
- Silver Lake Conference Center- year-round outdoor ministry of the Southern New England Conference, UCC.
- Fidelco Seeing Eye dog foundation- provides animals and education for people who are blind or with very limited vision.

CHRISTMAS PROJECT

Adopt a Family through HKYFS

(Haddam Killingworth Youth and Family Service)

This year we participated in the Christmas HKYFS Adopt a Family program using a different format. In early November, Carol Matregrano contacted HKYFS to indicate our desire to adopt one or more families. She was given the lists for two families. One had two children, the other had one child. The committee meet virtually and decided on 7 gifts per child. One family requested mostly clothes, the other had mostly toys. A list was then put on the Sign-up Genius app along with the directions, etc. The list included the approximate cost for each toy. Eight spots were included for gift cards of unspecified amounts and vendors. The link to the site was shared in the weekly emails, the *Belfry* and announced at church. All the slots were filled;

fifteen members participated. Two people also included a book for each child, and one added coloring books and crayons. Participants were asked to bring the gifts unwrapped and to place the gift cards in an envelope with the vendor and amount on the outside. These were brought to the HCC parking lot on Saturday, December 12 from 10-11a.m. Because of COVID, everything was all socially distanced. The gifts were put directly into the appropriate large Christmas bag dedicated to that child. Envelopes with gift cards were collected in a small separate gift bag. The bags were double checked and the gift cards distributed between the two families with the larger family receiving a slightly higher value. The cards varied from \$15-50 and were to Walmart, Stop and Shop, Amazon, AJ Pizza, Subway, Kohls, and Target. The total value of the gift cards was \$420. The gifts and cards were taken to HKYFS on Tuesday, December 15th. They were gladly received, and two families had more to enjoy on Christmas day.
