
Dear Haddam and Higganum Friends,

With Easter on April 4th, Ash Wednesday feels early this year. Yet since 2000, Easter has been in March five times, and in the single-digit days of April five more. It turns out this year's dates for Ash Wednesday and Easter are distinguished only by their ordinariness.

Perhaps I am just not ready to hear *"From dust you came and to dust you will return."* On the other hand, I am more than ready to hear *"He is risen! Alleluia!"*

Liturgically, and often in our lives, we are required to spend a good long while on the path of dust before we arrive at glory. It can be hard to remember that there ever was or believe there ever again will be rejoicing.

The map of Covid19 cases per 100,000 population for Connecticut has looked about



like what you see here for a long time: almost every town at the highest alert level. By comparison, when we planned for and enjoyed in-person hybrid worship last

fall, Haddam was grey (lowest level), yellow, or at worst (signaling-imminent-return-to-distance-worship-only) orange.

On the one hand, we have started vaccinations (including for many in our congregations- yay!), and it can be projected from encouraging Israeli data that we might see a resultant improvement in infection rates soon. On the other hand, we are aware of the circulation of new strains of Covid19. Approaching the anniversary mark of the dramatic changes in our lives wrought by the pandemic, we sigh with David, *"How long, O Lord?"* (Ps. 13:1)

Psalm 13 is a *'song of lament.'* *"When we lament, we experience healing from God; we trust the unfailing love of God and keep coming back to that. We hold on even in the face of discouragement and temptation to give up, and we also look ahead to the day when God brings resolution."* – Calvin Institute of Christian Worship [Psalm 13 Service](#)

Here ["In the Bleak Midwinter,"](#) may we be honest about the challenges we continue to

face in this pandemic, and know that God is with us and cares for us.

Let us remember: this will not last forever, but [faith, hope, and love](#) will.




CHURCH JOINING DISCUSSION

The main topic at the joint meeting of FCCH and HCC on January 24th was “What’s next?” Several members expressed their desire to move forward with a decision regarding the two churches’ future collaboration/status. The challenge of doing this work using virtual rather than in-person gatherings was noted, but a number of workable ideas were proposed. Pastor Michelle will consult with interim ministry colleagues about adapting to our current context a “fishbowl” discussion tool often used in interim ministry, and will bring a proposal to the Church Council at its February meeting. One planned component will be for members to reflect in writing on their hopes and fears (the specific question has not yet been formulated) and then share and hear others’ responses. It is likely that this work will coincide with the Lenten period of self-reflection. Please listen on Sundays and look in the weekly emails for more information.

February 2021 Belfry: Joint Diaconate

The Diaconate continues to work on Sunday services with Pastor Michelle. Planning for Lent has started with Ash Wednesday being on February 17. Also being discussed with Pastor Michelle and the Joint Council is how to adapt to in-person Sunday services when it is permitted. There have been requests that the remote Zoom Sunday services be continued, if possible, even while conducting in-person Sunday services. We are evaluating our options and technical support requirements. With a new Joint Diaconate being assembled after the annual meeting, we will be realigning the Deacons (Shepherds) with the congregation (Sheep). The purpose of assigning a Deacon to each member/church friend is to provide at least one point of contact so everybody is being periodically checked on and to provide a source of church information.

MIDWEEK STUDY

We have obtained access for our members and friends to the 2021 Illustrated Ministry Lenten Devotional "Where Your Heart Is."

The Devotional spans the six weeks of Lent and Easter week, and can be used by youth and adults. It includes meditative coloring and written reflection pages, scripture texts, and applications.

Its weekly themes are:

Week 1 Storing Up Treasures (Matt. 6:19-21)

Week 2 Sharing Our Hearts (Luke 2:41-52)

Week 3 Knowing the Good (Matt. 19:16-26)

Week 4 Consider the Lilies (Luke 12:13-34)

Week 5 Becoming Someone New (Matt. 14:45-46)

Week 6 Shifting Our Gaze (Mark 9:30-37)

Week 7 Sharing Our Treasures (Matt. 27:62-28:10)



WHO? Volunteer Mission teams from all over the northeast come to western Maine to share their talents and caring with area homeowners, who without assistance with labor and/or materials, would be unable to make needed repairs and maintenance to their homes. Many of the volunteers take vacation time to be here.


WHAT? Painting, roof repairs, porches, steps, ramps and simple interior and exterior repair are likely prospects for the teams. Wherever possible, we ask homeowners and families to participate in the work and its cost. At times the mission can help with materials through grants and donations.

WHERE? Franklin County for the following areas/towns: The "Greater" Farmington area, Chesterville, Jay, N. Jay, Livermore Falls, Wilton, New Sharon, Temple, Strong, New Vineyard. Also, western Somerset County for the following areas/towns: New Portland, Lexington, Highland Plantation, Embden, N. Anson, Anson. Volunteer work groups stay in North New Portland and Farmington, and we like to keep the work within 30 minutes of these towns.

WHEN? Volunteer Mission teams arrive during the months of June, July and August.

WHY? The North Parish Housing Ministry was created to help people in need stay in their home by doing needed repairs they could not otherwise afford to do. The volunteer Mission teams seek to do Christian service.

MATE-NPHM determines what applications are accepted based on the skill levels of the volunteer teams and the extent and complexity of the work requested, doing their best to prioritize the requests as to those most in need of assistance. [They] keep in mind that the work will be done by volunteers with varying skill levels [and work] is done with the safety of the volunteers as [their] highest priority.




SAVE THE DATE: FRIDAY, MARCH 5TH PAINT NIGHT
