Dear Haddam and Higganum Friends,

Let's try an experiment in doing big three things at once.

Like many clergy, I have more than one book on church growth. I usually hesitate to open them during interim times since the energy of the churches I serve is more rightly dedicated to addressing pressing issues and the pastoral search process.

I agree with the authors of my books that growth is essential to church flourishing, but usually my part in it is to help a church get as healthy as possible and find its next settled pastor, since these are good starting places for future growth efforts.

This is fine during the typical six-month to two-year interim. As our time working together stretches towards two and a half years, and your "in between time" since your settled pastor's departure towards three, and as your churches more fully reopen from Covid, I know I am not alone in feeling the need for more.

Whether or not the two churches formally join, there is a consensus that your ministry going forward will be shared. There also is something like consensus that this collaboration ought to be a springboard to growth.

In this rescheduled summer Olympics year, we'll be able to see springboards in action. The first part of a good vault is a strong run to gather force. Even before that, though, the gymnast has to locate and point their body toward the springboard.

This summer, in a pair of brief sermon series- "Ready" (July 11-25) and "Set" (August 8-21), I will share some of what is in my books about this first stage of orienting churches toward growth. To provide access for those who are traveling, we will make sure the texts of these sermons are available online (in addition to the streamed services on YouTube).

I hope what we learn together will provide energy and direction to the work of your committees as they plan for the fall start up, as well as being a resource on which you can draw in the future with your settled pastor.

The other two big things (preparation for late September votes on joining the churches and supporting the Search Committee's process) will continue as well. I would ask that you actively participate in and above all, PRAY for each of these endeavors.

# WORSHIP

In Person or Online  
COVID-19 RESPONSE

Our gatherings for public worship may include unvaccinated individuals as well as those at increased probability for Covid19 complications due to age or health conditions. Those attending our gatherings do so at their own risk. We encourage all youth and adults 12+ attending worship to be fully vaccinated.

All worshippers are asked to familiarize themselves with and abide by the following guidelines **(updated June 20, 2021)**:

- Please do not attend in-person worship/ events if you or a household member have symptoms of Covid-19 or if you have a known exposure (regardless of vaccination status).
- Any unvaccinated persons are asked to wear a mask covering mouth and nose while on the church campus, except while actively eating or drinking outdoors (when they should maintain social distance from other households) and during Communion.
- Fully vaccinated persons may go without a mask except while singing. Worship leaders will model replacing their own masks for the hymns, and the worship bulletin will include reminders.
- Hand sanitizer will be available. Please avoid passing objects (e.g. hymnals, bulletins) from person to person.
- Offerings may be placed in the plates as you arrive or as you depart after the service.
- Enter the Sanctuary as traffic flow signs direct unless using the ramp (FCCH) or elevator (HCC), and leave promptly following worship through the door nearest you (please do not congregate in HCC Fellowship Hall).
- The rear right quadrant of the Sanctuary and the balcony will continue to be reserved for distanced seating.
- Our worship will include congregational singing throughout.



- There is no Nursery/in-person Sunday School at this time.
- A summer schedule for hosting outdoor fellowship with refreshments (pre-portioned, self-serve snack and cold beverage) is printed below. Please contact the designated committee in advance to contribute items so they can plan for serving.



Sanctuary windows and doors will be open and fans used for ventilation (moving air out of the building, not for comfort). If very high temperatures or humidity are expected, services may be moved outdoors; notice of this will be made in the weekly email.

Restrooms are available for emergency use; they are located on both levels at FCCH and near the Sacristy and in the education wing at HCC. Our church buildings are cleaned weekly when in use, with restrooms and high-touch surfaces sanitized.

### MODERATORS' MISSIVE

A Note from Your Moderators

June 30, 2021

Dear Members and Friends.

A special Joint Council meeting was held last night at the Higganum Congregational Church. This meeting was held as a follow-up to the June 6th congregational gathering with the intent to structure/plan our next steps as we go forward with the process of joining our two congregations.

With both churches represented by council quorums, a total of four unanimous votes were taken separately by each church. The votes were:

- (1) A vote to present the joining issue to the two churches at a September congregational meeting.
- (2) A vote to set the date for this meeting as September 26th following worship.
- (3) A vote to set the wording of the question to be voted on as, "Should the Higganum Congregational Church and the First Congregational Church of Haddam combine to form a new church?"
- (4) A vote to establish a 2/3rds majority of members voting as necessary to pass the September 26th question in votes to be taken by separately by HHC and FCCH.

Again, all four votes taken by each council separately passed unanimously. There are many details to be worked out before we reach the September 26th meeting. If you have questions, please feel free to contact your moderators and council members. At this point we felt it was important to give members and friends information on the plan the joint council has approved.

### SCHOOL BAGS for CHURCH WORLD SERVICE

We have 43 hand-made school bags that need to be filled. The list of items is very specific. It is suggested that you wait to purchase items until mid-July or when the school supplies are on sale. It is then possible to complete a bag for just \$3 or \$4 dollars.

Each bag will have:

- 1 pair of blunt scissors
- Three (3) 70-count spiral bound notebooks
- One (1) 30 cm/12-inch ruler
- Six (6) new unsharpened pencils with erasers
- One (1) hand held pencil sharpener
- One (1) large eraser
- One (1) box of 24 crayons

In 2020, 13,020 school kits were delivered in the United States. Church World Service shares in a hope-filled tomorrow.

Your support truly makes a difference in the lives of children and families here at home and all over the world.



## BREAD FOR SALE
