



Hello My Friends,

May the Joy of Christmas fill your hearts as you prepare for the year upcoming!

What a marvel it is to share the moments of creating Christmas for each other! It is amazing how the sentiments of the heart can be shared even when our traditions are disrupted.

As my children and I visited family and friends in New York City to share Yuletide cheer this year, we didn't go to Macy's nor Rockefeller Center. Nor did we see the Christmas lights at Saks Fifth Avenue. Nor did we go to Radio City to see the Rockettes in their Christmas Spectacular, nor any other Broadway show. Nor did we attend the Christmas at St. Patricks. We simply stayed in, admiring the cityscape through our windows, and avoiding all of the NYC events that have heralded and celebrated our Christmases of old.

And what a lovely and wonderful time we shared! Ever deepening circles of shared time converge to bring us to into this new moment of sharing together. Now, with Christmas behind us and a New Year ahead, I feel the full presence of God's mystery unfolding all around us.

I feel so very fortunate to be a part of this larger community of faith which has faithfully strived to "Be the Church" together over the centuries. From 1700 to now, our character, proved by history, is one of continual renewal and transformation. Before any of us discovered either of our churches, they were inspired by God and neighbor to build a community of Faith. We each entered this community in a different time and place, and by our adoption into this community, we share its collective history. We have come through a series of fires and meeting houses. We have

come through divisions that brought both minister and congregation to form a new community in Higganum in 1844. We have come through years of reunification discussions. And we have been steadily making our way through a pandemic that has changed our world's commerce and culture.

Now, on Sunday January 2, I will be beginning my New Year celebration by joining our churches. Though some might see this as the formal prerequisite of the United Church of Christ process of "Installation" of the new minister into the church of "Call", for me this is an important moment in our journey together. The search committee diligently searched, as did I. The congregation voted upon our mutual recognition of a match in faith. Now we have shared some time together, and I have experienced you as a community of faith. I have worshipped together with you and begun to share in your journey. This has prepared the way for me to formally and publicly join our larger community as a full member. In the UCC, the joining of any church is theologically considered to be a re-affirmation of one's baptism. It is recognition that one's faith and one's search for God's meaning and action in life is larger than one's own life or ambitions, and must be discovered and lived together in community with others. One affirms the fundamentals of belief and commits to the shared journey with others. One willingly promises to undertake the responsibilities that faith. Although it is a preamble to my being "Installed" as your minister, how could I be "your minister" if not first joining into your history and considering the community to be my own?

Each step along this journey allows us to pause to see ask for God's guidance, sanction, and support. Each step along this journey brings us more deeply into the shared history of the past. Each step along this journey prepares us to more fully envision and enact God's will as we shape our community's future.

I thank you all for the ever-flowing outpourings of welcome you have shared with me since my arrival. I thank you for the lovely flowers, foods,

Christmas gifts and sentiments that you have showered upon me. I thank you for the serious conversations we've shared about where you've been and where you're going. I thank you for sharing your personal hopes, fears, pains, and triumphs with me, and for all of the moments of sharing worship and fellowship together.

All of these moments bring me forward to this moment of joining the churches, and increase my capacity to support our shared journey toward unification.

May we "Be the Church" together in the New Year! May we continually revitalize our faith! May we discover new ways to experience and share God's Love together as one body of faith.




Per our Covid safety procedures: Food and drink should be pre-portioned, self-serve for individual pick up (food items wrapped or plated, not self-serve, and beverages prepackaged or poured by a host wearing mask and gloves). As weather permits, doors and windows may be open.



We welcomed Pastor Hilary as our new settled minister. As we get to know each other better and the current church practices and styles, there may be small changes in our services. A few that have already taken place is to start the Sunday service promptly at 9:30 am with 'private' joys and concerns and then begin 'live-streaming' when complete. Another one is that we are encouraging the use of 'prayer cards'. These can be filled out at the beginning of service and will be picked up by the Deacons during first hymn. This will provide a written record of prayer requests which can be included in church programs. One last change is during the last hymn, the Pastor will follow the Deacon with the lighted candle holder to the back of the Sanctuary where she will then give the benediction.

We will also be making available and encourage the wearing of name tags. This will help the minister and all of us to better learn the names of our fellow worshipers.

Since the number of Deacons will be decreasing in 2022, we will be soliciting and encouraging others to participate in the reading of scripture during the service. If you would like to volunteer to assist in the church service 'readings', please notify Terry Smith.



Due to various commitments, classes and obligations that are scheduled in several different work areas and involvements in the new year, I have asked for and been granted a four month leave from the organist / choir director position at both churches (January through April 2022). The choir and churches will have better continuity with a steady substitute musician during these times. I will miss seeing and working with so many of you on a weekly basis, it has been a joy to know you all (5 plus years at Higganum, 21 years at Haddam).
