# Message from the Pastor

Hello Friends,

May the peace of the Lord resonate in our hearts!

As we have been walking along our Lenten journey, considering our covenant with God and the signs we offer to God, I wanted us to consider another reading and revisit the topic of shame, which we have been talking about during Lent.

Earlier in Lent, I encouraged people to pray about discovering their own healthy "middle way" of shame, for too much shame is crippling, and too little shame allows our flaws to reign unchecked in our lives. The "middle way" of shame helps us see our flaws and gives us the desire to try to redeem ourselves from society. We were talking then about how we feel about our internal shame or shame we feel inside our hearts.

Now let's think about external shame, or shame that others try to make us experience.

Isaiah 50:4-7, one of our lectionary readings for Holy Week, reads, "The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning, he wakens—wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught. The Lord God has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious; I did not turn backward. I gave my back to those who stuck me and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insults and spitting. The Lord God helps me; therefore, I have not been disgraced; therefore, I have set my face like flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame."

This external shame is the aspect of shame Jesus faced from the time of the Last Supper and into the crucifixion: social shame, rejection, and punishment. External shame could be deserved or unjust, and for Jesus, this shame was a direct consequence of living out his passion and spiritual truth. Isaiah describes how the teacher knows how to sustain the weary with a word. The one who listens spiritually to God's language as it is spoken through the fabric of the universe is often not understood by others. These sensitive spiritual souls sometimes face indifference, misunderstanding, and even ridicule, anger, or violence from others.

When facing this kind of external shame, Isaiah and Jesus both "did not hide their face from insult and spitting." Though socially disgraced, they could hold their heads high and maintain inner dignity, relying upon their relationship with God and their knowledge of God's teachings. For, as Isaiah says, "the Lord God helps me."

My prayer for you as you walk beyond Holy Week and into the Easter season is that the Lord God will be with you and will help you. May God protect you in the face of any unjust social shame.May God give you the strength and clarity to speak your spiritual truths to others simply. May you resist any temptation to socially shame others. May you reflect upon these deeper mysteries in prayer, and may God grant you the patience and will to practice forbearance and forgiveness and a deepening of faith through the love of Christ.

May the peace of Christ dwell in your heart,



## **Christian Education News**

Happy Spring from CE! March was a busy month! In March, we held the first of our evening adult education classes. We are following the Living the Question Series, Violence Divine: Overcoming the Bible's Betrayal of Its Non-

Violent God. Professor and author John Dominic Crossan summarizes the essence of his bestselling HOW TO READ THE BIBLE & STILL BE A CHRISTIAN: Struggling with Divine Violence from Genesis Through Revelation and shows the way forward for those seeking an authentic Christianity for the 21st century. The lecture begins with the story of Adam and Eve. Professor Crossan states that it "is a story of conscience. It says to get over the delusion of immortality and accept the responsibility of conscience." A very interesting thought, in my opinion. Very different from what I believed the story was meant to teach us. I am looking forward to the next video to see where he takes us next! Adult Ed with CE is held on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday evenings, 7 pm- discussion closes, at the Higganum campus. We will supply you with everything else you will need; just bring your listening ear and an open heart!



On March 23, 2024, the confirmands, Joe Rizzo and Ryan McCue, and I stayed overnight at the First Congregational Church of Old Lyme. We joined the FCCOOL confirmation event called Sharing Our Humanity. Guest speaker Kathy told us about her story of how she became homeless two different times in her life. She spoke openly about her struggles with addiction, loss, and her journey to recovery. She is currently on the hunt for an apartment and hopes to move out of the Homeless Hospitality Center located in New London, CT, in the upcoming months. We then assembled 95 toiletry kits! Kits included socks, soaps, hygiene wipes, toothbrushes, razors, shave cream, shampoo, conditioner, ChapStick, feminine

hygiene products, and deodorant. The kits will be delivered during Holy Week for distribution at the shelter. We met new friends and learned a lot. We left early on Sunday morning to head back to attend Palm Sunday service, but not before the boys and I had a good hearty breakfast at Jack's and picked up Norm Manning for church! The boys were very respectful, helpful, and polite. Thank you, Joe and Ryan, for making me proud!


