A HUGE THANK YOU for making a local family's holiday wishes come true!!! We provided Christmas gifts, with little advance notice, for a 17-year-old GIVING TREE girl, a 16-year-old boy, and a 15-year-old

boy. I was extremely impressed by HK Youth and Family's devotion to this community project and I look forward to more combined projects in 2025.

Cookie Walk 2024 was a huge success with 70 platters created and sales on December 14th totaling over \$5,200.

Quilt Show 2024 was another huge success with record-breaking attendance yielding a profit of \$4,294.

We are continuing the Pennies from Heaven Collection for Lincoln until the end of February. He is at the top of the heart transplant waiting list but has had to stay in the hospital in Boston since last April. The family started a GoFundMe campaign last spring which raised funds to help cover the expense of renting an apartment near the hospital. Our goal is to raise funds to purchase gift cards that can be used anywhere: food, clothing, gifts...etc. Lincoln's birthday is the end of February and what a gift of support we can bring.
